Program Description

Dental technology is the art and science of designing and fabricating custom made corrective devices and replacements for natural teeth. The goal and challenge for a dental technologist is to create a restoration that is a perfect match to a patient's natural dentition. Technological revolutions have allowed computer-based modeling to support a broad application to the fabrication process. Dental technologists are an essential member of the dental team.

Kirkwood's Dental Technology program encompasses digital dentistry in preparing you in five speciality areas: dentures, partial dentures, ceramics, orthodontics, and crowns and bridges. As part of the program curriculum, you'll work with commercial dental laboratories and the University of Iowa College of Dentistry and the Dentistry Clinic to gain hands-on experience.

The Dental Assisting, Dental Hygiene, and Dental Technology programs are accredited by the Commission on Dental Accreditation. The Commission is a specialized accrediting body recognized by the United States Department of Education. Dental Technology graduates are eligible to take the Recognized Graduate examination, which is one of the first steps leading to certification as a certified dental technician (CDT). This examination is administered by the National Board of Certification in Dental Laboratory Technology.
